

You Make Me Happy Watercolor Card



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Stampin' Up! Supplies:

- STAMPS – Flirty Flowers (143873 wood OR 143872 clear mount)
- PAPER – Whisper White (100730)
- INK – Basic Black Archival (140931), Wild Wasabi (126959), Daffodil Delight (126944), Soft Sky (131181)
- OTHER – Aqua Painters (103954), Layering Circle Framelits (141705), Big Shot (143263), Gold Metallic Thread (138401), SNAIL (104332), Stampin' Dimensionals (104430), Rubbing Alcohol

Cutting & Scoring:

- Whisper White - 8 ½" x 5 ½", score and fold at 4 ¼"
- Whisper White – 3 ¾" x 5" and 2 ½" x 5"

Instructions:

- Stamp the daffodils in Basic Black ink (3) times at the bottom of the 3 ¾" x 5" cardstock.
- Stamp "You make me happy" and the tiny flowers in black ink on the left side of the 2 ½" x 5" Whisper White cardstock.
- Fill the small tip Aqua Painter with rubbing alcohol.
- With the lid closed, press the lid of the Daffodil Delight ink pad onto the ink itself to make a small puddle of ink inside the lid. Press the barrel of the Aqua Painter to allow the rubbing alcohol to flow. Wipe off on a paper towel to remove any excess.
- Pick up the ink with the Aqua Painter and color in the daffodils. As it dries, add a little extra ink to the bottom petals to make them a deeper color. Dot on some ink on the tiny flowers on the sentiment.
- Clean any excess ink off the Aqua Painter by brushing it back and forth on a paper towel until it comes clean.
- Press the lid of the Wild Wasabi ink pad in the same manner and color the stems and leaves.
- Press the lid of the Soft Sky ink pad in the same manner and brush over the word "happy".
- Adhere the stamped cardstock onto the card base.
- Die cut the sentiment with the 1 ½" circle die. Die cut the scallop circle that is just a tad bigger on the opposite side. Layer together with SNAIL.
- On the back of the sentiment, place a Stampin' Dimensional up near the "You" and the "y" in "happy". Press metallic thread onto the dimensionals and make loops.
- Add (2) additional dimensionals and adhere on the left side of the card.
